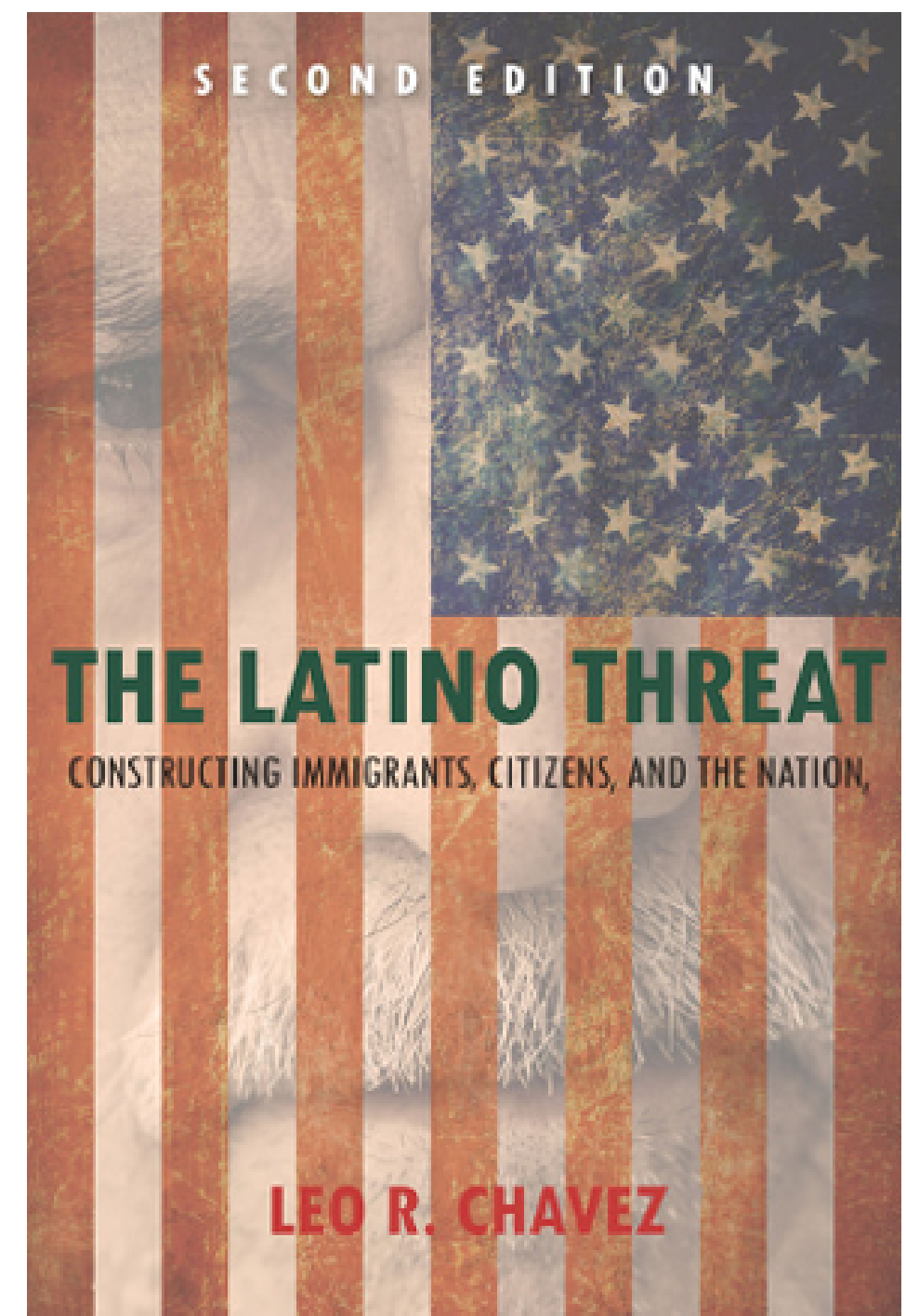
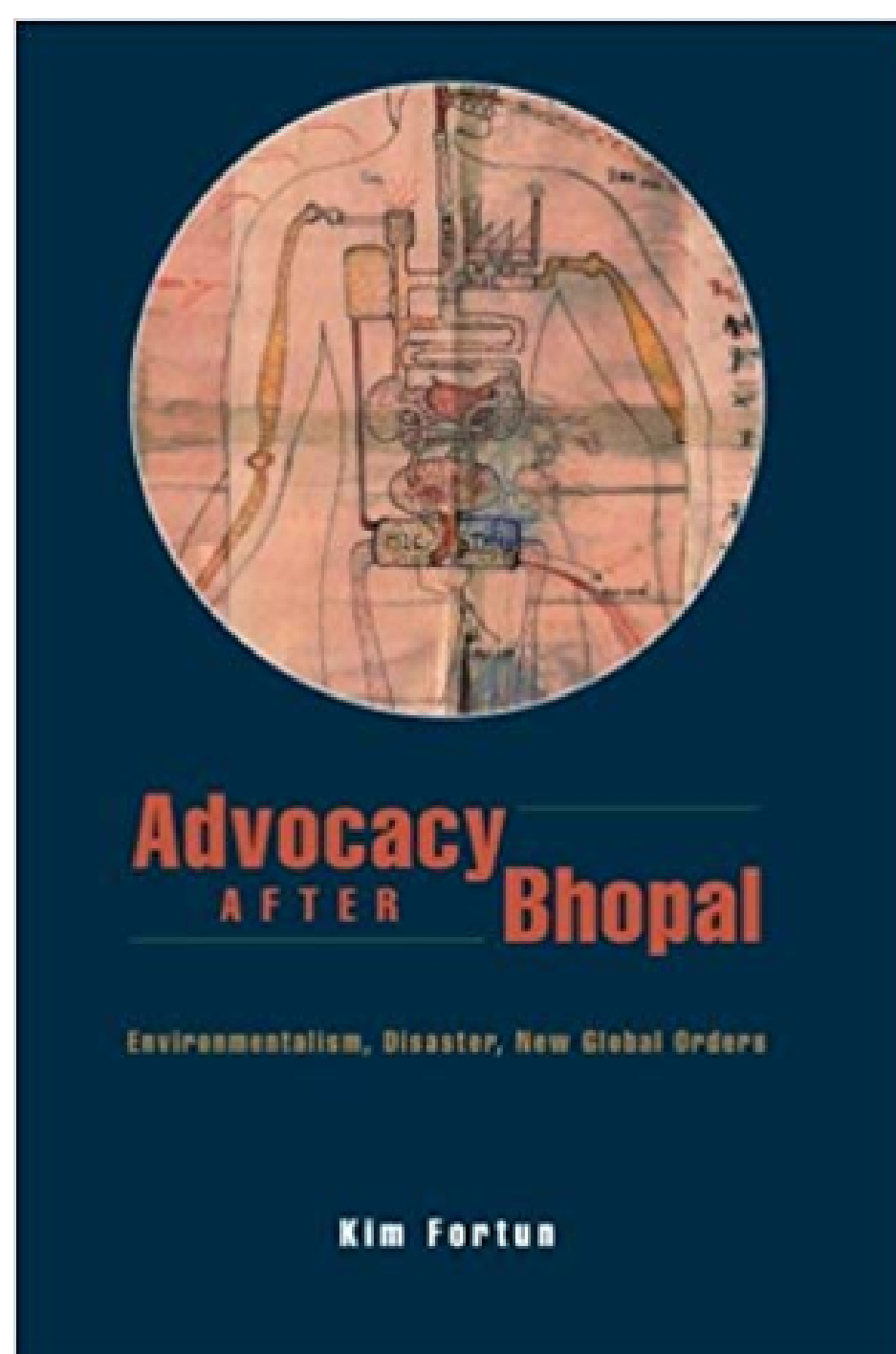
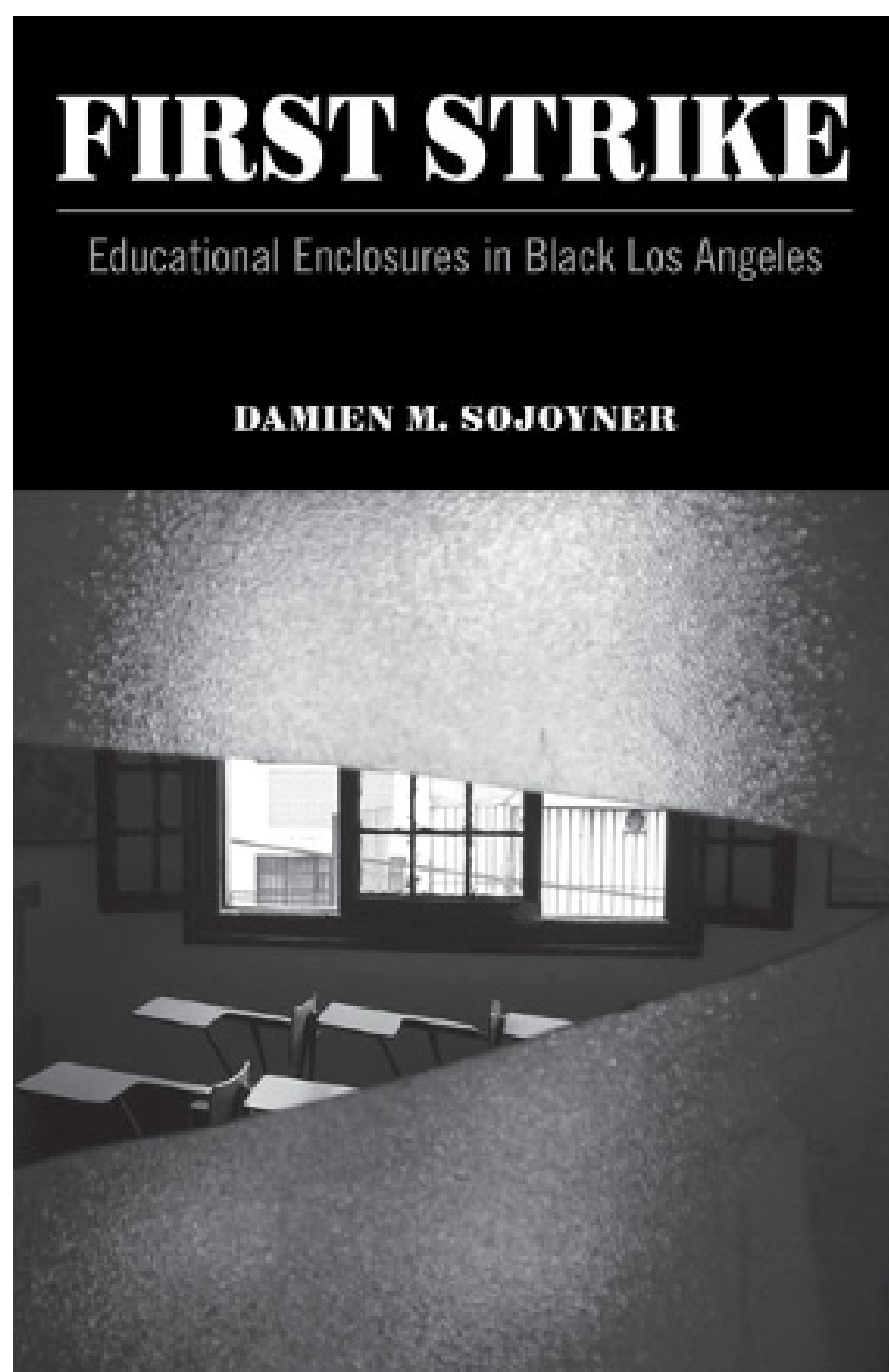


## How is the future of this STS formation envisioned?

In coming years, UCI Anthro will be working to interlace research topics often kept separate -- linking, for example, Professor Damien Sojoyner's work on prisons, schools and black communities to Professor Kim Fortun's work on toxic communities and environmental injustice. Together, they hope to show how the conditions that produce incarceration are toxic in biophysical, socio-technical, and cultural ways. UCI Anthro's strength in migration studies can also be interlaced with its strength in environmental studies, drawing out how climate change and other environmental burdens drive migration, diaspora and an array of associated challenges.
