
## What events have marked the development of this STS formation?

The "World Multiple" international symposium brought anthropologists working on science, technology, and indigenous and vernacular knowledges together in Osaka in 2016. The symposium was an outgrowth of the JSPS-funded project "A comparative study of "Indigenous Knowledge" and "Modern Science"" led by Keiichi Omura. This project explored "an approach that temporarily brackets the conceptual opposition between the two [indigenous knowledge and modern science], and investigates the concrete processes that emerge within regional social, economic, and political mechanics."
